The world of the hero of the poem will no longer be same after the loss, it has break to pieces: «That, it is empty now, – the talk isn't about that, suddenly I noticed – we were two. It seemed to me that the wind blew away the campfire, when he didn't come back from the battle». It seems that everything is as always, but at the same time the most dear man is missing, which the hero didn't even think about before.

The main idea is that life is precious. You need to preserve every moment with your family and friends, because you never know what will happen tomorrow, and that's the worst thing.

In conclusion, I'd like to crucial that Victory Day is a very important date that reminds people of this. History can't be denied, so that it doesn't happen again in the future.

pretext.







No matter how many years have passed since the tragic events of the GreatPatriotic War, we will remember it with horror and fear. Not only because millions of people of different nationalities died, but also because no one issafe from war even now, as we can see.

It's hard to imagine military planes bombing houses and constant starvation. As well as the children of the war until June 1941 could not even imagine what awaited them and how much hardship they would have to endure. My great-grandfather was 12 years old when the war came to their village. He remembered how he and his sister seek frozen potatoes or beets in the winter fields. Remembered how they ate even grass because of famine during the occupation. It was him, who told me about how inhuman and terrible can be people, whose heads are clouded with false ideas. I've forgotten many of his stories, but there's one I will remember my whole life.

A little historical background: in 27th of October 1941 german troops occupied Ivnya, a small village in the Belgorod region. Fascists were everywhere, they shot and hanged civilians. The note "About the monstrous atrocities of the German invaders committed by them in the Ivnyansky district" preserved in the state archive testifies that 165 civilianswere killed on the territory of Ivnya during occupation.

My great-grandfather Kostya told me the story of his miraculous salvation. Cold winter of 1942. Kostya was playing snowballs, riding down ice slideswith other little boys. Children remained children, even in the terrible circumstances, even if there was a war around them. In the middle of the game, kids saw a German soldier approaching them. Kostya's friends scattered away and he was alone with the enemy. At that moment life flashed before his eyes. The soldier went to him and abruptly took off his warm fur cap and put it on his head. The frost was fierce then and the cap with ear flaps was the only protection from the freezing cold. Kostya was shocked and the fear paralyzed him. He thought that he'd be taken to concentration camp or something worse, but the soldier turned and walkedaway. A few minutes later scared boy ran home. How lucky he was in that day. But not only luck saved him. That soldier was an exception to the rule, he took pity on the boy and didn't harm him. He got what he needed without the use of force, but who knows what he was capable of if my great grand-father resisted.

The Ivnya was liberated from the Nazis only in February 1943, 6 months after the battle of Kursk, that changed the situation at the front. 5865 Ivnyaresidents fought on various fronts, of which only 1177 people returned from the battlefields. Kostya's father was one of them. We, the descendants of the victors, have to know about what happened in our motherland during the war, to know the **true price of peaceful life**, to honor and remember the real heroes.
